



Nuisance behaviour on Beetwell Street and McDonalds Chesterfield.

Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Over recent months we have received a number of calls to report anti-social and nuisance behaviour based around the bus shelters on Beetwell Street in the town centre and at McDonalds, Low pavement Chesterfield.

The concerns have been from bus passengers, members of the public and people who work in these areas, about underage drinking, bad language, smoking and damage.

Patrols are being carried out and we are taking appropriate action against any individuals found to be responsible, but we would ask for your support in helping us to reduce these concerns.

Please talk to your child about anti-social behaviour, the effect it can have on others and the possible consequences of their behaviour.

If they are going out with friends during the evenings, please find out where they are going and encourage them to meet in appropriate places. The bus shelters are provided for those people waiting for public transport and Queen's Park should only be used during opening hours.

We understand that most young people are not causing anti-social behaviour and simply want to be able to socialise with their friends, we just ask for you to encourage them to consider how others might feel, and to have respect for public areas.
