

All students at Outwood Academy Newbold have access to a wide range of careers provisions that include independent, impartial advice and guidance relating to their options at school and how these may affect their career pathways. This aims to provide students with the knowledge, inspiration and ability to take ownership of their futures.

- **Careers Convention** – Held on Tuesday 27th November 2018 between 6pm-8pm our Careers Convention invites colleges, apprenticeship and training providers, Universities and local, national and internationally recognised companies and employers from a range of sectors including Microsoft, The Army and The University of Sheffield.
- **Careers Cafes** – Running on Wednesday February 27th 2019, Wednesday March 27th 2019 and Wednesday April 10th 2019, our Careers Cafes provide students with the opportunity to speak with a range of employers with each Café focussing on a specific area of industry. The focus of each Café is yet to be confirmed and will be based on feedback from the Careers Convention held on the 27th November 2018.
- **Careers VMG sessions** –A week long careers programme is designed and delivered (dates tbc) to all students via their VMG groups. The sessions build on the skills and knowledge developed in Life lessons and provides additional stimulus to students of what it takes to be successful in the world of work.
- **Careers Life lessons in Half term 1 (Y7-11)**
 - KS3: Pupils gain an understanding of the world of work, career preparation, equal opportunities and the importance of developing their skill set. They explore the choices that their subjects within school will offer them and engage with the Y9 option choices that are available to them via the online careers platform Unifrog that shows pupils where their options may take them.
 - KS4: Pupils build on the knowledge and understanding of careers they have gained in KS3. Career preparation in the form of CV's, covering letters, personal specifications, the interview process and the importance of how you should present yourself on your first day at work are all covered in detail. Pupils are also introduced to the social and moral aspects of careers discussing gender stereotypes, equal training opportunities, work life balance and worker and employer rights. Career pathways such as post-16, college opportunities, apprenticeships, university and adult education are all focussed on in more detail.
- **Careers Guidance sessions (6th form)**

Students in our 6th form receive weekly guidance sessions. As part of this provision students focus on many aspects of further education and careers preparation. This includes mock interviews with their tutors, UCAS sessions including Russel Group and clearing focuses and student finance sessions. This year students from Oxford University will speak with our 6th form about their journey and what life is like at a world leading University.
